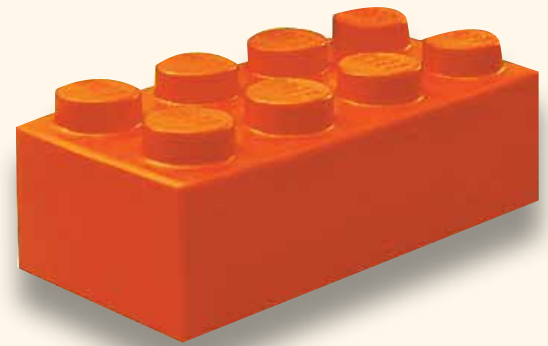
Week 4: July 25 – 29 Skies Over Hogwarts Camp
